B.Sc. Nursing (Basic)

B.Sc. Nursing (Basic) - 4 Years Course: Bachelor of Science in Nursing is an undergraduate course in the stream of nursing. The duration of the bachelor's degree in nursing is of 4 years.

1. Entrance Exam: Admission to the B.Sc. Nursing Programme shall be made strictly through the Punjab Para Medical Entrance Test (PPMET-2026) and the centralized counselling process conducted by Baba Farid University of Health Sciences (BFUHS), Faridkot.

2. Eligibility: -

- a) The basic eligibility for the course is 10+2 in Physics, Chemistry, and Biology.
- b) The minimum age for Admission will be 17 years as on or before 31st Dec. of the year of Admission.
- c) The minimum Qualification Requirements shall be the passing of 12th in Science subjects- Physics, Chemistry & Biology, as per Indian Nursing Council norms.
- d) The student shall be medically fit.
- e) Married candidates are also eligible for admission.
- f) Students shall be admitted once in a year.

3. Reservation Policy: Reservation of seats in for admission in Nursing Colleges for SC/ST/OBC/EWSs/PH Admission under the reserved quota shall be subject to reservation policy and eligibility criteria for SC/ST/OBC/EWSs prescribed by the Government of Punjab / Baba Farid University of Health Sciences, Faridkot.

4. Residence Status:

Preference will be given to the candidates who are residents of Punjab. Resident of Punjab Means:

- a) The candidate should have born in the State of Punjab or
- b) The candidate who has studied 10+1 and 10+2 in Punjab or
- c) The candidate must be a permanent resident of the State of Punjab

5. Admission: After the selection / provisional allotment of seat during the counseling(s) by

Baba Farid University of Health Sciences, The selected students have to join the college for Admission as per the prescribed instructions on allotment letter and have to submit the mentioned certificates / documents in original for University Verification and Registration purpose. 6. Medical: Candidate should be medically fit and must produce the Medical Certificate issued by registered doctor (MBBS/MD/MS Practitioner doctor) at the time of admission along with other original certificates.

5. EXAMINATION REGULATIONS

Note:

1. Applied Anatomy and Applied Physiology: Question paper will consist of Section-A Applied Anatomy of 37 marks and Section-B Applied Physiology of 38 marks.
2. Applied Sociology and Applied Psychology: Question paper will consist of Section-A Applied Sociology of 37 marks and Section-B Applied Psychology of 38 marks.
3. Applied Microbiology and Infection Control including Safety: Question paper will consist of Section-A Applied Microbiology of 37 marks and Section-B Infection Control including Safety of 38 marks.
4. Applied Biochemistry and Applied Nutrition and Dietetics: Question paper will consist of Section-A Applied Biochemistry with 25 marks and Section-B Applied Nutrition and Dietetics with 50 marks.
5. Pharmacology, Genetics and Pathology: Question paper will consist of Section-A of Pharmacology with 38 marks, Section-B of Pathology with 25 marks and Genetics with 12 marks.
6. Nursing Research and Statistics: Nursing Research should be of 55 marks and Statistics of 20 marks.
7. A candidate must have minimum of 80% attendance (irrespective of the kind of absence) in theory and practical in each course/subject for appearing in examination.
8. A candidate must have 100% attendance in each of the practical areas before award of degree.
9. Following exams shall be conducted as College exams. The minimum pass is 50% except for Communicative English. The marks for all the college exams listed below alongside all other university exams must be sent to university for inclusion in the mark sheet and shall be considered for calculating aggregate and ranking for awards by university.
 - i. Communicative English
 - ii. Health/Nursing Informatics and Technology
 - iii. Professionalism, Professional Values and Ethics including Bioethics
 - iv. Introduction to Forensic Nursing & Indian Laws

Award of rank will not be considered for those who fail in one or more courses and must have completed the program by 4 years.

The mark sheet with grades and grade point average shall be given by the University for all courses.

Communicative English and Elective Modules are not included for calculating Semester Grade Point Average (SGPA).
10. Minimum pass mark shall be 40% for Communicative English and in each of the Elective module. All Electives modules must be completed as indicated in specified semester and pass marks sent to university before appearing for final examination.

11. Minimum pass marks shall be 50% in each of the Theory and practical papers separately except in English.
12. The student has to pass in all mandatory modules placed within courses and the pass mark for each module is 50% (Refer Appendix 2).
13. A candidate has to pass in theory and practical exam separately in each of the paper.
14. If a candidate fails in either theory or practical, he/she has to re-appear for both the papers (Theory and Practical).
15. If the student has failed in only one subject and has passed in all the other subjects of a particular semester and Grace marks of up to 5 marks to theory marks can be added for one course/subject only, provided that by such an addition the student passes the semester examination.
16. The candidate shall appear for exams in each semester:
 - i. The candidate shall have cleared all the previous examinations before appearing for fifth semester examination. However, the candidates shall be permitted to attend the consecutive semesters.
 - ii. The candidate shall have cleared all the previous examinations before appearing for seventh semester examination. However, the candidates shall be permitted to attend the consecutive semesters.
 - iii. The candidate shall have cleared all the previous examination before appearing for final year examination.
 - iv. The maximum period to complete the course successfully should not exceed 8 years.
17. The candidate has to pass separately in internal and external examination (shall be reflected in the marks sheet). No institution shall submit average internal marks of the students not more than 75% (i.e. if 40 students are admitted in a course the average score of the 40 students shall not exceed 75% of total internal marks).
18. At least 50% of the Non-nursing subjects like Applied Anatomy & Physiology, Applied Biochemistry, Applied Psychology & Sociology, Applied Microbiology, Pharmacology, Genetics, Nutrition & Dietetics, Communicative English and Health/Nursing Informatics & Technology should be taught by the Nursing teachers. Teachers who are involved in teaching non-nursing subjects can be the examiners for the program.
19. Maximum number of candidates for practical examination should not exceed 20 per day. Particular year and of same institution batch shall be examined by the same set of examiners.
20. All practical examinations must be held in the respective clinical areas.
21. One internal and one external examiner should jointly conduct practical examination for each student.
22. An examiner for theory and practical/OSCE examination should be an Assistant Professor or above in a College of Nursing with M.Sc. (Nursing) in concerned subject and minimum 3 years of teaching experience. To be an examiner for Nursing Foundation course, the faculty having M.Sc. (Nursing) with any specialty shall be considered.

23. Examiner for Competency Assessment – VIII Semester: There must be a total of five examiners, one from each specialty i.e. External examiners – 2 and Internal examiners – 3. The internal examiners may be from the college faculty or from hospital with the required qualification and experience i.e. M.Sc. (Nursing) in respective specialty with minimum three years of teaching experience.

VII. ASSESSMENT GUIDELINES

1. Grading of Performance

Based on the performance, each student shall be awarded a final grade at the end of the semester for each course. Absolute grading is used by converting the marks to grade, based on predetermined class intervals.

Examination Guidelines

1. Shall have one regular examination followed by supplementary examination in a year.
2. If a candidate fail they can be promoted to next year
3. A candidate can take any number of attempts with a condition that maximum period allowed is 6 years. However all previous papers need to be cleared before appearing in the final examination
4. No institution shall submit student average internal marks more than 75% i.e., if 40 students are admitted in a course than the average score of the 40 students shall not exceed 75%.

Example of 5 students: A=25, B=20, C=22, D=21, E=24

Average score=89.6%

This will not be accepted by the State Nursing Registration Council

5. Minimum pass marks should be 50% in each of the Theory and practical paper separately.
6. Minimum pass marks shall be 40% for English only.
7. Theory and Practical exams for Introduction to Computer to be conducted as School exam and marks to be send to the SNRC/ Board for inclusion in the mark sheet.
8. A candidate has to pass in theory and practical exam separately in each of the paper.
9. If a candidate fails in either theory or practical paper he/she has to re-appear for both the papers (Theory and Practical)
10. Maximum number of candidates for practical examination should not exceed 20 per days.
11. All practical examination must be held in the respective clinical areas.
12. One internal and one external examiners should jointly conduct practical examination for each students.

Eligibility for Admission to Examination

A candidate shall be eligible for the admission to the state Council / Board examination if the Principle of the school certificate that:

- (a) She / he has completed not less than eleven months of the course
- (b) A candidate must have minimum of 80% attendance (irrespective of the kind of absence) in theory and practical in each subject for appearing for examination.
The diploma shall not be awarded to the student till she /he has completed the clinical / field requirements.

2. Question paper should have a combination of essay, short answer and objective type question as detailed in the content
3. All units of a subject and sub-subject should be given due weightage in accordance with the instructional hours prescribed.

PRACTICAL EXAMINATION

1. Practical examination is to be conducted in the respective clinical area.
2. Nursing teacher with minimum of five years of teaching/clinical teaching experience in a particular subject/clinical area may be appointed as practical examiner.

PLEASE NOTE

Mere inclusion in the merit list and appearance for scrutiny of certificates does not guarantee admission to a course. All admissions are subject to fulfillment of all the eligibility conditions by the candidates. If it is found at a later stage, during active verification, that the candidate has given false information/ certificates or is found to have concealed some information, his/her admission will be cancelled without any notice. - Fee for clinical training will be charged as fixed by the Govt. for private hospital. Any item/enquiry not covered by the above shall be decided by the management whose decision will be final in every respect.
- Online Library Fee (HSLIBNET Fee) will be charged time to time as per the notification of Baba Farid University of Health Sciences.
- Mohali court is the jurisdiction for all legal matters.
- Management reserves the right to revise the fee structure.

Examination & Registration Fee:

Each student of B.Sc. (Basic & Post Basic), GNM & Certificate courses will have to pay fee and other charges for the University Counseling Fee, Examination Fee & Registration Fee.

Violation of hostel regulations may result in disciplinary action, including withdrawal of hostel privileges.

To promote the holistic development of students, opportunities are provided to participate in religious, social, cultural, sports, and professional activities. Students are encouraged to utilize their leisure time productively and engage in activities that contribute to their physical, intellectual, and personal development.

Hostel Rules, Regulations and Discipline

The hostel is an integral part of the educational environment and aims to provide a safe, disciplined, and supportive atmosphere conducive to academic excellence and personal development. Every hostel resident is required to comply with the following rules and regulations:

General Conduct

1. Students shall maintain cleanliness and hygiene in their rooms and common areas, including recreation rooms, washrooms, and dining facilities.

2. Students are responsible for the proper care of hostel furniture, fixtures, and other property. Any loss or damage shall be recovered from the concerned student(s).
3. Consideration, courtesy, and respect for fellow residents are essential for harmonious community living.
4. Cooking inside hostel rooms is strictly prohibited.
5. Wastage of water, electricity, or any other resources may invite disciplinary action.

Safety and Security

1. Students must ensure that all lights, fans, and electrical appliances are switched off before leaving their rooms.
2. Rooms must be properly locked when unattended, and keys should be kept safely.
3. Students are advised not to keep valuables, jewellery, or large amounts of cash in the hostel. The College shall not be responsible for any loss, theft, or damage to personal belongings.
4. Proper locks should be used on cupboards, boxes, and personal luggage.
5. Keeping pets in the hostel is strictly prohibited.

Dining Hall Regulations

1. Meals shall be taken only in the dining hall during the prescribed timings.
2. Removal of food, crockery, utensils, glasses, or furniture from the dining hall is not permitted.
3. The hostel mess operates under the supervision of the Management. Mess charges and arrangements may be revised from time to time.

Visitors and Parent Interaction

1. Visitors are permitted only during the prescribed visiting hours and may meet students in the designated visitors' room.
2. Visitors are not allowed inside student rooms.
3. Parents or relatives may visit students only during authorized visiting hours. Only those relatives whose photographs have been submitted at the time of admission shall be permitted to visit.
4. Parents wishing to discuss the academic progress of their ward may meet the College authorities during working hours on weekdays.

Outings and Leave

1. Students may avail hostel outings as per the schedule and conditions prescribed by the College and Hostel authorities from time to time.
2. Students must return to the hostel by the prescribed reporting time and record their movements in the Outing Register.
3. Students attending religious, social, or educational activities outside the hostel must obtain prior permission from the Warden or designated authority.
4. Students leaving the hostel on weekends or off days must sign the register indicating the correct time of departure and return. Signing on behalf of another student is strictly prohibited.

5. Students intending to travel outstation must obtain prior written permission from the Principal.

Hospital Visits

1. Students shall not visit the hospital while off duty unless:
 - Officially called by the ward/unit;
 - Seeking medical treatment; or
 - Visiting an admitted relative or friend with prior permission.
2. Written permission from the Warden shall be obtained before leaving the hostel for such visits.
3. Students shall observe the prescribed visiting hours and wear the prescribed uniform whenever required.

Health and Welfare

1. Any illness or medical condition must be reported immediately to the Principal, Warden, or designated authority.
2. Students requiring medical attention shall follow the procedures prescribed by the College.

Hostel Accommodation

1. Hostel accommodation is mandatory for all students, except local students as approved by the College authorities.
2. Room allotment shall be made solely by the Principal/Warden and shall be final.
3. Hostel and mess fees must be deposited within the prescribed schedule.

Library Usage

Students using the library facilities shall record their attendance in the prescribed register and comply with library regulations.

Discipline

Students shall strictly abide by all College and Hostel Rules and Regulations. Any act of misconduct, indiscipline, insubordination, and immoral behavior, damage to property, unauthorized absence, or conduct prejudicial to the interests of the institution shall render the student liable to disciplinary action, including suspension, withdrawal of hostel facilities, or rustication from the College.

The Management reserves the right to amend, modify, or introduce new rules and regulations from time to time, and all students shall be bound by such amendments.

Uniform

Wearing of the prescribed uniform is compulsory for all students within the College campus as well as during clinical postings in hospitals and community settings.

Note: Students shall perform clinical duties in various shifts as per the rotation plan prepared by the College to fulfill the clinical experience requirements prescribed by the regulatory authorities.

Note: Leave availed beyond the prescribed limit shall result in a deficiency of training period. Such deficiency must be compensated through make-up duties during vacations or by extension of the training period, as determined by the College.

Eligibility for University Examination

A student shall be eligible to appear in the University Examination only if the Principal/Head of the Institution certifies that:

1. The student has completed not less than eleven months of the academic year and has maintained satisfactory overall performance during the period of study.
2. The student has secured a minimum of 80% attendance separately in theory and 100% in practical/clinical training.
3. Students falling short of the prescribed attendance requirement shall not be permitted to appear in the examination.
4. The minimum passing requirement shall be 50% marks in each subject separately in theory and practical examinations, as prescribed by the University and regulatory authorities.

Maximum Duration for Completion of Programme

A student may avail any number of attempts to clear the prescribed examinations, subject to the maximum period permitted for completion of the programme as stipulated by the regulatory authorities:

B.Sc. Nursing (Post Basic)	4 Years
General Nursing and Midwifery (GNM)	6 Years

Students must successfully clear all preceding semester/year examinations in accordance with the regulations and guidelines prescribed by the Indian Nursing Council (INC), New Delhi, the affiliating University, and other statutory authorities before becoming eligible to appear in the final year/final semester examination of the respective programme.

ANTI-RAGGING POLICY

Sri Guru Harkrishan Sahib College of Nursing, Sector 77, SAS Nagar (Mohali), Punjab, maintains a strict zero-tolerance policy towards ragging. In accordance with the regulations of the statutory authorities, the College has constituted an Anti-Ragging Committee to prevent, prohibit, and address incidents of ragging within the institution, clinical training areas, and hostel premises.

Objectives

- To ensure a safe, secure, and conducive learning environment for all students.
- To prevent and prohibit ragging in any form within the College, Hospital, Community, and Hostel premises.
- To promote mutual respect, dignity, and harmony among students.
- To promptly address complaints and take appropriate disciplinary action against those found guilty of ragging.

Prohibition of Ragging

Ragging in any form is strictly prohibited within the College campus, Hospital, Community training areas, and Hostel premises. Any student found indulging in, abetting, instigating, or promoting ragging shall be liable for disciplinary action in accordance with the regulations of the Indian Nursing Council (INC), affiliating University, and other statutory authorities. Since ragging is a punishable offence under law, the College may also initiate appropriate legal proceedings against the offenders.

Reporting and Assistance

Students and parents/guardians are encouraged to report any incident or apprehension of ragging immediately. In case of any emergency or distress arising out of ragging, they may contact the Principal, Nodal Officer, Hostel Warden, or any member of the Anti-Ragging Committee for immediate assistance and necessary action.

According to UGC Regulations on Curbing the Menace of Ragging in Higher Education Institutions, 2009, the committee has been constituted to prohibit, prevent and eliminate the scourge of ragging in the College including:

- i. Any conduct by any student or students whether by words spoken or written or by an act which has the effect of teasing, treating or handling with rudeness a fresher or any other student;
- ii. Indulging in rowdy or in disciplined activities by any student or students which causes or is likely to cause annoyance, hardship, physical or psychological harm or to raise fear or apprehension thereof in any fresher or any other student;
- iii. Asking any student to do any act which such student will not in the ordinary course do and which has the effect of causing or generating a sense of shame, or torment or embarrassment so as to adversely affect the physique or psyche of such fresher or any other student;
- iv. Any act by a senior student that prevents, disrupts or disturbs the regular academic activity of any other student or a fresher;
- v. Exploiting the services of a fresher or any other student for completing the academic tasks assigned to an individual or a group of students.
- vi. Any act of financial extortion or forceful expenditure burden put on a fresher or any other student by students;
- vii. Any act of physical abuse including all variants of it: sexual abuse, homosexual assaults, stripping, forcing obscene and lewd acts, gestures, causing bodily harm or any other danger to health or person;
- viii. Any act or abuse by spoken words, emails, post, public insults which would also include deriving perverted pleasure, vicarious or sadistic thrill from actively or passively participating in the discomfiture to fresher or any other student;
- ix. Any act that affects the mental health and self-confidence of a fresher or any other student with or without an intent to derive a sadistic pleasure or showing off power, authority or superiority by a student over any fresher or any other student.

Note: Every student is expected to uphold the dignity, respect, and well-being of fellow students and contribute towards maintaining a ragging-free campus environment.

General Rules and Regulations

To maintain discipline, professionalism, and a conducive learning environment, all students shall adhere to the following rules and regulations:

1. Students shall not display, circulate, or paste any notice, poster, or communication within the College premises without prior written permission from the Principal. Students are also prohibited from communicating directly with any external authority regarding College matters. All such communications shall be routed through the Principal. Violation of this rule may invite disciplinary action.
2. The College shall not be responsible for any personal debts, financial liabilities, or obligations incurred by students during the course of their study.
3. Students shall neither solicit nor accept gifts, money, favors, or any form of remuneration from patients or their relatives. Similarly, students shall not offer gifts to members of the College, Hospital, or clinical staff in their individual capacity.
4. Students shall be responsible for the proper care and use of College, Hostel, Library, Laboratory, and Hospital property. Any loss of, or damage to, institutional property shall be recoverable from the concerned student(s).
5. The following are strictly prohibited within the College, Hostel, Hospital, Community Training Areas, and any premises under the jurisdiction of the Institution:
 - a. Possession, consumption, distribution, or being under the influence of alcoholic beverages.
 - b. Possession, use, or distribution of narcotic, addictive, psychotropic, or hallucinogenic substances, except when prescribed for medical purposes and used under authorized supervision.
 - c. Smoking, vaping, or use of any tobacco or nicotine-containing products.
 - d. Possession, carrying, or use of firearms, explosives, or any other dangerous or prohibited weapons.
 - e. Gambling, betting, or participation in any activity involving games of chance for monetary or material gain.
6. The Principal, Hostel Warden, or any authorized College official may conduct inspections or surprise checks of College and Hostel premises whenever considered necessary. Students found violating institutional rules shall be subject to disciplinary action.
7. Cases of misconduct, indiscipline, or violation of institutional regulations shall be dealt with by the Principal and the competent authority. Depending upon the nature and gravity of the offence, disciplinary measures may include warning, written apology, fine, suspension, rustication, or expulsion from the Institution.

Compliance

All students are expected to uphold the values of discipline, professional ethics, mutual respect, and responsible conduct. Ignorance of the rules shall not be accepted as an excuse for non-compliance.

Student Undertaking and Affidavit

At the time of admission, every student shall submit an affidavit affirming that he/she has read, understood, and agrees to abide by all rules and regulations of the College and Hostel. The affidavit shall also confirm compliance with the code of conduct, disciplinary regulations, anti-ragging provisions, and other institutional policies in force from time to time.

The affidavit must be executed on a non-judicial stamp paper of 50/- value and duly attested/notarized by a Notary Public. Failure to submit the prescribed affidavit within the stipulated time may result in withholding of admission formalities or other appropriate action as deemed necessary by the College.

The prescribed format of the affidavit is provided below and must be submitted at the time of joining the course.

Withdrawal from the Course

A student who seeks to withdraw from the programme after the completion of the final round of counselling and admission process for the respective academic session shall be liable to comply with the fee regulations prescribed by the College and the affiliating authorities.

In such cases, the student shall be required to clear all outstanding dues and pay the applicable fees and charges as per the prevailing rules, including any fee liability for the remaining duration of the course, wherever applicable and as permitted under the regulations of the concerned statutory authorities and the admission policy in force.

The request for withdrawal shall be submitted in writing to the Principal, and the issuance of a No Dues Certificate, Relieving Certificate, and other relevant documents shall be subject to fulfillment of all financial and administrative obligations.

Migration

Migration from any other nursing college affiliated with Baba Farid University of Health Sciences (BFUHS), Faridkot, shall not ordinarily be permitted. However, requests for migration may be considered in exceptional cases, subject to the prevailing regulations of the University and with the prior approval of both the University and the Principal of Sri Guru Harkrishan Sahib College of Nursing, Sector 77, SAS Nagar (Mohali), Punjab.

Clinical Postings and Practical Training

Clinical exposure is provided to students from the first semester onwards to facilitate the integration of theoretical knowledge with practical skills and professional competencies.
